Why is it important to use sources in academic writing?

Validates your **conclusions and recommendations** for future practice.



Supports and contextualises your ideas and critical arguments.

The CRAAP Test:

The CRAAP Test is a helpful 'checklist' for assessing the reliability and credibility of a resource. This checklist is usually presented as a list of questions and examines:

Currency – the timeliness of the information.

Relevance – the importance of the information to your needs.

- Authority the source of the information.
- Accuracy the reliability, truthfulness, and correctness of the content.
- **Purpose** the reason the information exists.

CRAAP Test: Useful Questions



TIP!

When gathering sources for an assignment, it is good practice to **interrogate the literature** by asking these questions.

Currency: The timeliness of the information

- When was the information published or posted?
- Has the information been revised or updated?
- Is the information current or out of date for your topic?

Relevance: The importance of the information for your needs

- Does the information relate to your topic or answer your question?
- Have you looked at a variety of sources before choosing this one?

Authority: The source of the information

- Who is the author/ publisher/ source/ sponsor?
- What are the author's credentials or organizational affiliations given?

Accuracy: The reliability, truthfulness, and correctness of the content

- Is the information supported by evidence?
- Has the information been reviewed or refereed?

Purpose: The reason the information exists

- What is the purpose of the information?
- Does the point of view appear objective and impartial?

Before searching for online sources, you need to look at your assignment brief and identify key **subject-matter words** and **limiting words** to generate search terms.

Subject-Matter Words	Describe the topic you should be writing about.
Limiting Words	Help narrow the focus of your answer.

Generating Alternative Search Terms

You may find the search terms you have generated are not yielding good results. Therefore, it is useful to think of alternative search terms by making a list of synonyms.

Identifying Appropriate Resources: Currency

When identifying appropriate resources to use in your assignment, **consider the timeliness of the information**. When was the article published? Is the information up to date?

Identifying Appropriate Resources: Currency

You can use the tool bar on the left-hand side to **sort by date** and **relevance.** You can also **adjust the date range** accordingly.





TIP

Identifying Appropriate Resources: Authority

When identifying appropriate resources to use in your assignment, it is a good idea to **check the author's affiliations, number of citations** and **publishing history**.

A key skill on the degree apprenticeship is to be able to **identify resources** which are **relevant for your purposes**. Does the information relate to your **topic** or question?

When do you need to provide references in your assignments?

You should provide a reference whenever you include an idea or piece of information from another source.

This could be a **paraphrase**, **direct quote** or a **summary**.

- → Journal Articles
- → Conference Papers
- → Videos
- → Government Reports
- → Websites

Introduction to Referencing

Where do you need to provide references in your assignments?

1	In the main body of the assignment	In-text citations appear next to the idea or piece of information you have included from another source (within the same sentence).
2	At the end of the assignment	Your reference list provides the full publication details of the sources cited in the assignment.

In-Text Citations



In-Text Citations

TIP!



An in-text citation is a **short acknowledgement included whenever you quote or take information from a source** in academic writing. It gives enough information to uniquely identify the source in your reference list.

Regardless of the source type, the format of your in-text citation will generally be:

<u>QA Harvard</u>: (Surname, Year) or (Organisation, Year) <u>Solent Harvard</u>: (Surname Year) or (Organisation Year)

In-Text Citations: Tips

If there is no named author, use the **name of the organisation**.



If you cannot find a date of publication date, try to **find** the **same information elsewhere**.



If there are **four or more authors** you must include the first named author, followed by 'et al.'



Look at pages 5-10 of the <u>QA Apprenticeships Harvard Referencing</u> <u>Guide</u>, *or* pages 1 and 4 of the <u>Solent Harvard Referencing Guide</u> for guidance on formatting multiple citations, sources with the same author and year and secondary citations.

Reference List



Your reference list appears at the end of your assignment. **Each reference list entry corresponds with an in-text citation in your main body**, providing further details of publication so your reader can identify and verify the source.



Different sources, e.g. books, journal articles and conference papers, are formatted differently.

Always use your <u>QA Apprenticeships Harvard Referencing</u> <u>Guide</u> or <u>Solent Harvard Referencing Guide</u> to complete your references.

Referencing: Tips



Only include the **first initial** of the author's name.



Always use the official **referencing guide** to format your entries correctly for different source types.



Store your sources so you can refer back to them if necessary, e.g. OneNote, Excel Spreadsheet, Word Document, Favourites, Collections.



Reference as you go! Avoid leaving your referencing until the last minute.



Do not use automatic reference generators!

Searching for sources and incorporating them into your work is a non-linear process





The 'C' in the CRAAP Test stands for 'Credibility'





Google Scholar enables you to assess the authority of the author by sharing author affiliations and number of citations





References appear in two places in your assignment: the main body and reference list
